

## Sample Schedule

Please note that this is a sample schedule. Specific course offerings may vary from quarter to quarter.

### Begins Winter 2006

Classes do not meet every week; instead, classes meet six times during the quarter in the following format: Mondays and Wednesdays from 4 to 8:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

#### ORIENTATION

Prior to the first week of class, you attend the Center for Programs in Education orientation on the Seattle campus. Registration, e-mail accounts and student services information are covered, in addition to specific sessions designed for each education program.

#### COURSES

For specific examples of the course curriculum, please see the program fact sheet, available from the Admissions Office. The curriculum covers the content required by Washington state for the elementary education endorsement and provides the necessary teaching methods coursework.

#### FIELD EXPERIENCE

While field experiences are integrated throughout the program, before student teaching takes place, there will be some days when you will be required to participate in field experience in a school classroom. Over the 10-week quarter when this concentrated field experience occurs, you will be required to fulfill 20 hours of observation in a school classroom. This experience is set up by the field placement officer in conjunction with the faculty.

#### STUDENT TEACHING

During the last quarter of the program, you complete a student teaching internship. Several factors determine where you will do your student teaching. Although Antioch cannot promise to accommodate your school of preference, the field placement officer will make every attempt to do so. Student teaching generally takes 10-12 weeks (or 120 hours) to complete. A synthesis day at the end of the quarter allows students to present information about their student teaching experience to their peers and the faculty.
